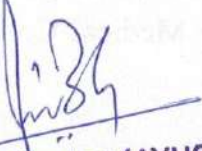

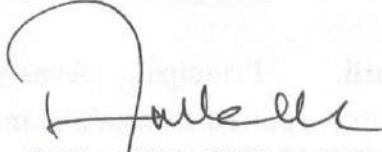
On careful consideration of the proposal, the Government of Karnataka has decided to issue a “No Objection Certificate” to the applicant for establishmentof a new Ayurveda Medical College with an intake capacity of 60 (Sixty) seats in BAMS Degree Course.

It is certified that:-

- a) The applicant owns and manages a 60 bedded hospital.
- b) It is desirableto establish an Ayurveda College in the public interest, with admission capacity of 60 seats.
- C) Establishment of Ayurveda College at No # 9.8.7 16/4, Opposite. To KIMS Kidadal Road, Koppal-583231,byAgastya Ayurveda Medical College and Hospital,Koppal is feasible.

It is also certified that adequate clinical material as per norms of the National Commission for Indian Systems of Medicine are available with the proposed Medical College. It is further certified that in case the applicant fails to create infrastructure for the Ayurveda College as per NCISM norms and fresh admissions are stopped by the NCISM/Central Government, the State Government shall take over the responsibility of the students already admitted in the college with the permission of the Central Government.
